how to place a hold

1. Go to www.fepl.ca
2. In the upper right corner, click on the white silhouette of a person.
3. Enter your entire library barcode number (found on the front of your library card), as well as your PIN.
4. Click on the last drop down box, and select **Libraries in Niagara Cooperative** at the top of the list.
5. Click on the empty box, and type in the title or author you are searching.
6. When you find the item you want, click on the **blue place a hold** button.

7. Check that your pick up library, as well as your preferred notification method is selected.
8. Click **Submit** at the bottom. 
9. Your hold has now been placed.

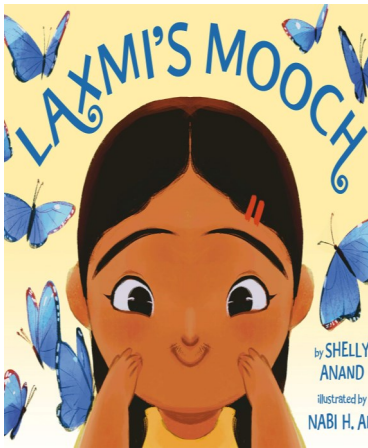
Understanding Catalogue Statuses

Please see the table below to understand what the different statuses in the catalogue means.

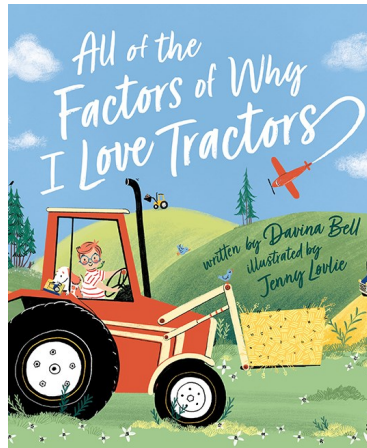
You can find these statuses when you looking to place holds, checking on your holds, or searching the catalogue to see if you item is available.

Status	Meaning
Available	Item is available at the indicated location.
Checked out	Item is checked out by another patron.
ON ORDER	Item has been ordered and has not yet arrived.
In process	Item has been received and is the process of being catalogued.
Lost or Missing	Item is lost and cannot be found.
Damaged	Item is damaged and is not circulating at this time.

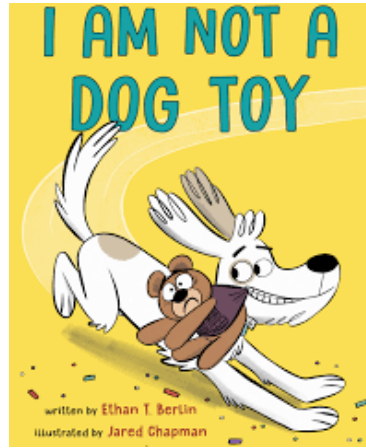

Teens, are you looking to complete volunteer hours as a requirement? Earn hours by submitting a book review!

Each approved review will earn you five hours of community service.

In order to earn five hours of community service, teens must read books that meet the following criteria:

- Must be available through the Fort Erie Public Library;
- Must be published in 2020 and/or 2021;
- Must not have been previously reviewed on the blog; and
- Must be an appropriate reading level

Additionally, reviews must meet the following criteria:

- Must be at least 250 words in length (or longer);
- Must contain an introduction to the book, a brief summary (without spoilers), a thoughtful review, as well as whether or not you would recommend the book;
- Be an original review. Plagiarism will not be accepted;
- An original, staged photograph; and
- Contains no graphic or explicit language.
